COVID-19 RESPONSE

Just wanted to keep you updated on what is happening here at NACA. We are definitely in uncharted territory and each day brings new challenges.

The Governor of Arizona has closed all schools for the rest of the school year. However, included in that mandate is the expectation that we will keep the kids learning by long distance. This has been a challenge as very few of our students have access to internet or computers. Our teachers have had to be creative, especially in the lower grades. The staff here have really risen to the occasion and have pulled together in unity.

We have come up with the response plan as follows:

- Packets are being sent out to students along with food boxes. We hope to have these out weekly but it may be difficult with the "stay-at-home" orders surrounding us.
- We are staying in touch by phone with students, including the mentors with their assigned mentorees, so we can encourage spiritual growth as well as academic.
- We are providing daily devotionals for our students on our school Facebook page who have phones.
- We have been in communication with the college as to how to proceed for our students that don't have internet access (we are still working that out).
- All Work and Witness teams have been cancelled or postponed until June 1st under the direction of Global Headquarters. Some teams wanted a full refund while some made a donation to our ministry.

Staff response plan:

All buildings and residences have undergone a deep clean and then sanitizing.

We are strictly adhering to CDC guidelines.



We are still ministering, still praying, and still planning. We know that God is in control and we rest in His will.
